








CCDFI Service Area Map

Since Inception 1996 – 2017

- √\$1.55 Billion cumulative lending, 1,820 total projects
- ✓ Paid a dividend to shareholders each of past 15 years

- √ 40% of loans to organizations with environmentally sustainable efforts










